Appendix 1

Each participant was interviewed individually after the third session was completed in week four by one of the researchers who recorded the caregiver's ratings for each video: (1) acceptance, (2) applicability, (3) helpfulness, and (4) usefulness. Each item was rated on a 10-point scale ranging from 1 to 10, with 1 indicating very unacceptable, very inapplicable, unhelpful, and useless in contributing to the caregiver's family health, and 10 indicating full acceptance, full applicability, very helpful, and very useful to the caregiver's health.
